Marcel Bergmann



For the last 20 years, Marcel has enjoyed an active musical career as a performer, composer, improviser and teacher. A laureate of several international competitions (as one half of the acclaimed Bergmann Piano Duo) Marcel performs as a duo pianist, soloist and chamber musician nationally and internationally. He has recorded for the CBC, for several stations of the ARD in Germany, National Public Radio in the USA, as well as the Koch, Arktos, Brilliant Classics and Naxos labels.

Marcel has written numerous works for two pianos, film, theater and cabaret productions, as well as choral and chamber music. He has been commissioned by various organizations including the CBC, The Murray Dranoff International Two Piano Foundation, the Land's End Chamber

Ensemble, the Spiritus Chamber Choir, and the San Francisco International Music Festival.

For 10 years, Marcel was a core musician of the Calgary based group Land's End Chamber Ensemble, recipient of both the 2005 and 2006 Western Canadian Music Award for Outstanding Classical Recording. Marcel is also internationally active as a clinician, juror, and lecturer and has been involved as a collaborative pianist and vocal coach. In 2004/2005, Marcel and his wife were Artistic Directors of The Murray Dranoff International Two Piano Competition and Foundation in Miami. He has been on faculty at Mount Royal University, the University of Calgary, and served as Artistic Director of the Langley Community Music School. He has also been involved in various musical activities at The Banff Centre for the Arts. From 2009 to 2013, he was Professor of Music at Mohawk College in Hamilton, Ontario, and is currently Associate Artistic Director of White Rock Concerts as well as Director of Program Advancement at the Langley Community Music School where he also teaches piano, composition and chamber music.

Elizabeth Bergmann

Elizabeth Bergmann has an active performing career as pianist and chamber musician and is the recipient of many awards and prizes of international competitions such as the International Chamber Music Competition in Caltanissetta, Italy and the 4th Murray Dranoff International Two Piano Competition. She performs most regularly with her husband as the Bergmann Duo and has recorded numerous CDs with various ensembles and artists appearing on the Arktos, Naxos and Brilliant Classics labels.

Recitals and concerts with orchestra have taken her to many parts of the world including the United States, Italy, Germany, Holland, Greece and Canada.

Elizabeth is nationally and internationally involved as a lecturer, presenter and juror of festivals and competitions. She is Artistic Director of Concerts and



Director of Summer Programmes at the Langley Community Music School in Langley, BC and recently was appointed AssociateArtistic Director of White Rock concerts. She has been on faculty at The Mount Royal University in Calgary and at the University of Calgary and for many years was involved in various musical activities at the Banff Centre for the Arts. She was a core member of Calgary Land's End Chamber Ensemble and in the 2004-2005 season, she and her husband served as Artistic Directors of The Murray Dranoff International Two Piano Competition and Foundation in Miami.

A native of Alberta, Elizabeth received degrees in solo performance and chamber music from the Hochschule für Musik und Theater, Hannover, Germany, Université de Montréal, University of Toronto and University of Alberta. Her teachers have included Helmut Brauss, Patricia Parr, Jean-Eudes Vaillancourt and Arie Vardi.

Photocopies should not be presented to the adjudicator; to do so would break copyright laws. Please ask your teacher to supply you with an original if necessary.
- 2. Before handing in music at your class, be sure that your name is on the front of the music and that it is open to the piece being performed. Please help the adjudicator by numbering the bars at the beginning of each line of music.
- 3. Students who are not present when called up to perform will be called again at the end of the class. If still not present, the student will be considered a no-show and the fee will be forfeited.
- **4.** As a courtesy to performers, we ask that you:
 - ✓ DO NOT BRING FOOD OR DRINK INTO THE FESTIVAL
 - ✓ DO NOT TALK OR WHISPER DURING PERFORMANCES OR ADJUDICATIONS
 - ✓ ENTER AND EXIT ONLY BETWEEN PERFORMANCES
- **5.** If you bring younger children to the Festival or the Celebration Concert, please ensure that they sit quietly and do not talk or move around.
- **6.** We ask that all Festival participants and guests remain in the designated areas of the Festival location, so as not to unduly disturb other Church activities.
- 7. Entrants may not play on the festival piano outside of an actual performance.
- **8.** If you have a question regarding the Festival, please speak with your teacher. Do not under any circumstances approach the adjudicators for discussion of Festival matters.
- **9.** Students should dress in an appropriate manner. Avoid jeans, shorts, T-shirts with slogans, sweats, and bare midriffs.
- **10.**Recording of performances by a parent is allowed if discretion is used. Please, no tablet recording. Recording of adjudications is not allowed; please respect the privacy of our adjudicators. Please do not record other students.




