# Sergei Saratovsky

A winner of numerous awards including the First Place at the Porto International Piano Competition and the prize for Best Canadian Artist at the Montréal International Musical Competition, Sergei Saratovsky is recognized both in Canada and abroad as "a player of gargantuan proportions" and a "pianiste extraordinaire." This exceptional and versatile performer has a gift to take audience on a breathtaking voyage through the essence of music to the essence of beauty. The artist touches listeners with the sensitivity of his interpretations and impressive technique; his energy, focus and musicianship blend into a spectacular tour de force in performance. Saratovsky has performed in France, Italy, Australia, Portugal, Canada, the United States and Russia and appeared with the major orchestras in Canada and abroad. Originally from Karelia, Russia, he immigrated to Canada in 2002.

In 2012, Sergei Saratovsky was granted the degree of Doctor of Musical Arts at the University of British Columbia where he had studied with Jane Coop.

His fascination with chamber music has led the artist to establish a four-hand piano duo with his younger brother Nikolai Saratovsky, an internationally acclaimed pianist (Moscow-Taipei). Their dynamic ensemble has performed in Russia and completed three concert tours of British Columbia.

In addition to his performing career, Dr. Saratovsky enjoys giving master classes and is in demand as a guest clinician and jury member of international competitions and festivals. After the completion of the doctoral studies, he has continued his scholarly research activities through journal publications and participation in the international conferences. Currently, Saratovsky mentors and guides the advanced students in their musical studies at the VSO School of Music.

# **Michelle Mares**

A native of Vancouver, Canada, Michelle Mares began her musical studies at the age of 4 at Vancouver Academy of Music. She amassed a great deal of performing experience as a child prodigy and drew the attention of many notable musicians, including András Schiff, Ivan Moravec and Gaby Casadesus.

Ms. Mares has enjoyed the rare privilege of studying with some of the world's most eminent musicians including Canada's own Jane Coop, Leon Fleisher, Karl Heinz Kämmerling, György Kurtág, and Alfred Brendel. Her approach to music is deeply rooted in the treasured legacy of her teachers, and her own teaching is deeply influenced by it.



She has won many competitions including the Geneva International Competition, CBC Young Performer's Competition, the Hamburg Steinway Competition, the Montreal Symphony Competition, and the S.A.C.E.M. Prize at the Casadesus International Competition. She has performed internationally as a soloist and a chamber musician for most of her adult life and draws from a deep reservoir of professional experience.

Ms Mares is currently settled in Vancouver, BC where she has an active private teaching studio and has served as Adjunct Professor at the University of British Columbia. She was on the piano faculty at the University of Victoria for 10 years and is a popular guest adjudicator at music competitions throughout British Columbia.

April Smith has been teaching in her private piano studio for over 40 years. Her busy schedule includes teaching Royal Conservatory, Conservatory Canada (Classical and Contemporary) and rudiments. She received her ARCT Teacher's Diploma in 1984 and ARCT Performer's Diploma in 1999. She has studied in summer programs with Winifred Scott Wood in Victoria and Lillian Upright in Banff and has played in master classes with Jane Coop, Janina Fialkowska and Angela Hewitt. In 2004, April received the Tom & amp; Miggsie Lawson National Teachers' Scholarship, awarded to Conservatory Canada's top teachers.

April is a charter member of the Coquitlam/Maple Ridge Branch of the Registered Music Teachers' Association. An active member, April has held almost every branch position and is currently on the festival committee.

In her free time, April enjoys hiking, gardening and travelling but her greatest fulfillment comes from teaching.

# **Rita Attrot**



Rita Attrot has been teaching piano students of all ages and levels for more than thirty years. She also teaches piano pedagogy and is much in demand as an adjudicator. Rita received her early training at the Victoria Conservatory, a Bachelor of Music at the University of Victoria and a Master of Music degree in performance from the University of Western Ontario.

Ms. Attrot held the position of Staff Accompanist at Acadia University in Nova Scotia for 9 years, worked as a free-lance accompanist for instrumentalists and singers in Toronto, and served as a coach and repetiteur at the University of Toronto Opera School. She is currently Head of the Piano Department at the B.C. Conservatory of Music and also a member of the piano faculty at the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra School. For the past 20 years, Rita has been the music director at St. Thomas Anglican Church in South-East Vancouver.

# **Michael Sommerville**

Pianist and teacher, Michael Sommerville began studying music at the age of nine. Under the guidance of his first teacher, April Smith, his love and passion for music quickly blossomed. Michael completed his Associate Diploma in Piano Performance through Conservatory Canada, receiving an award for the top mark in the country. He continued his education at Douglas College then later at the University of British Columbia, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance. Michael's teachers have included some of Vancouver's leading musicians - Ellen Silverman, Dr. Terence Dawson, Rena Sharon and Dr. Patricia Hoy. Michael has also worked with world-renowned concert pianists such as Stephen Hough, Janina Fialkowska, Margaret Fingerhut and William Aide.



On the concert stage, Michael has appeared both as a soloist as well as a chamber musician, feeling equally at home in both settings. With eclectic tastes, his repertoire is diverse and ranges from Bach to Bernstein. Michael holds particular interest in exploring and playing music which is not often performed, whether it be underappreciated, little-known works by famous composers, or undiscovered masterpieces by obscure composers.

Michael has been teaching for over 20 years and maintains a successful studio. Michael takes a unique, highly personalized approach to teaching, synthesizing the diverse teaching methods of his many mentors. His passion for and dedication to teaching shows through his students, who consistently achieve top marks on their piano, history and theory exams and are frequently among the top performers in music festivals. Many of his students have been granted awards and scholarships for their successes. In 2008, Michael was chosen as a recipient of the Tom and Miggsie Lawson National Teachers' Travel & Study Scholarship, which is awarded to Conservatory Canada's top teachers. Furthermore, Michael is also an active piano and theory examiner with Conservatory Canada and has served as the coordinator of the North Fraser Music Festival since 2014.

# **Joanne Bender - Composition**

Joanne (Elligsen) Bender has been playing piano since the age of 7. She grew up near Stratford and participated in the Stratford Kiwanis Music Festival. Being part of a musical family gave Joanne plenty of experience performing as soloist and collaborative artist in school, community and church events.

At University of Waterloo from 1969-74, Joanne studied science in preparation for a teaching career. During this time she continued piano lessons privately with Erhard Schlenker in Kitchener. She completed her ARCT in Piano Performance as well as her B.Sc. and M.Sc. degrees. She was a frequent award winner at the KW Kiwanis Festival, a well-known pianist at U. of Waterloo, and appeared as soloist with the KW Junior Symphony conducted by Raffi Armenian. In 1974 she studied piano privately in Vienna, Austria with Dieter Weber, a teacher in the Vienna Academy. This was a life-changing experience for Joanne. Vienna, the city of music, became an inspiration to pursue a musical career.



Following her marriage to John Bender, and while raising their four children, Joanne expanded her piano teaching studio. In order to strengthen her musical education, she did a B. Mus. degree at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo and completed her M. Mus. at U. of Toronto in composition. Her teachers included Glenn Buhr, Peter Hatch, Christos Hatzis, Gary Kulesha and Chan Ka Nin.

Joanne is passionate about music. She is a full-time private teacher of piano, rudiments and composition in her Waterloo studio, with many talented students from beginners to advanced. Her students are frequent award winners at local and provincial competitions. She is involved in KW Kiwanis Music Festival, KW Symphony Love of Music Marathon, and KW ORMTA. She performs as a chamber musician in local concerts, and is a volunteer church musician. Joanne is a proud member of Red Leaf Pianoworks. Her compositions for piano appear in the Royal Conservatory of Music Repertoire albums and Canadian National Conservatory of Music Northern Lights series.


