Carter Johnson

Canadian pianist Carter Johnson is a highly acclaimed and versatile musician known for his interpretive sensitivity and imaginative programming. Born in 1996 on Vancouver Island, he began studying piano at the age of 5 and has since earned numerous accolades, including first prizes in international competitions like the 2023 Concours « Étoiles du piano » and the 2021 International Competition of Polish Music. He has also performed with prestigious orchestras and in renowned venues worldwide. Johnson's musical journey includes studies with notable mentors, including Shelley Roberts, Michelle Mares, Mark Anderson, Joseph Kalichstein, Matti Raekallio, and Wei-Yi Yang. He is currently pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Yale School of Music. Johnson's repertoire spans solo,

concerto, chamber, and vocal music, and he has a special interest in exploring lesser-known works, particularly those by nearly-forgotten Polish composers. Besides his expertise in J.S. Bach, he advocates for the music of various composers like Schumann, Fauré, Ives, Hindemith, Poulenc, Shostakovich, and Messiaen. In addition to his musical pursuits, Johnson is trained in elocution and holds an ATCL with distinction in speech and drama from Trinity College London. This skill is evident in his recitals, where he incorporates discussions on the music being played. His engaging program design and verbal introductions earned him the Best Program Presentation award in the Semifinal of the 2023 Sydney International Piano Competition.

Currently residing in Hamden, Connecticut, with his wife and two sons, Johnson maintains a busy schedule as a

Libby Yu

Vancouver pianist Libby Yu is recognized internationally as an accomplished performer, collaborator, teacher and adjudicator.

She captured the First Prize of the 27th CBC Radio National Competition for Young Performers and came into international recognition when she was awarded a Diploma of Honour at the 13th International Frederic Chopin Competition held in Warsaw, Poland.

A favourite with audiences, Libby has graced international stages including the Amsterdam Concertgebouw, Carnegie Recital Hall in New York, Le Chatre in Nohant, and the Ambassador Auditorium in Pasadena. She has appeared as soloist with major symphony orchestras such as the Netherlands Philharmonic, Montreal, Toronto, National Arts Centre, Saskatoon, Edmonton,



Vancouver, CBC Vancouver, Vancouver Metropolitan Orchestra, Manitoba Chamber and Victoria. Libby has recorded in studio and in recital for CBC Radio and collaborates regularly in various chamber music and duo recitals.

Libby has three solo albums: <u>Chopin Recital 1</u> and Chopin Recital 2. Her most recent solo album, featuring her heartfelt program for the "Recital For Hope" will benefit cancer research. Additionally, the recording <u>"Brahms: Sonatas and Songs"</u> with violist Nicolo Eugelmi was highly praised by the Strad Magazine.

She is a member of the exciting Aurora Piano Trio, touring much of BC and Vancouver Island. She was also had the honour of receiving the philanthropic Catalyst Award from BC Cancer in 2023 in recognition of her time, leadership and performances for the Foundation.

Dr. Yu earned her Doctorate of Musical Arts in Piano Performance and studied extensively with Lee Kum-Sing at the Vancouver Academy of Music and the University of British Columbia.

Anne Wilson Unger

Anne Wilson Unger has taught and conducted for 30 years, as well as working as an adjudicator and clinician throughout British Columbia and the Northwest Territories. She holds a Masters of Music in Piano Performance from the University of Western Washington in piano performance, accompanying and choral conducting. In addition, Ms. Wilson Unger also holds a BMus degree in Piano Performance from the University of Victoria with Dr. Robin Wood, an AVCM with the Victoria Conservatory of Music studying with Winnifred Scott Wood and an ARCT with the Royal Conservatory of Music. Anne spent time studying in England with Hamish Milne of the Royal Academy of Music and Isobel Flinn of the National Opera School.



For 10 years (1996-2007) Anne conducted the Amabilis Singers taking over from the much loved Diane Loomer, founder of the choir. Anne loved her time with Amabilis Singers performing such works as Handel's Messiah with the Vancouver Symphony (1997), the Brahms and Faure Requiems and Carmina Burana. Taking the choir to compete at the International Choral Kathaumixw (2004) in Powell River was such an amazing experience and huge highlight for her and the choir. Ms Wilson Unger loved the bi-annual Canteen Cabarets at the New Westminster Amouries on Nov 11 and the Choral dinner concerts at Bethany United with silent auctions. So many great memories working with such lovely people.

In addition to her work as a pianist, Ms. Wilson Unger is the co-founder and is a Director currently of the Vivo Children's Choir in New Westminster.



Bogdan Dulu

As a Jemini Foundation Chair, Bogdan Dulu can be heard playing the piano, celeste, synth, and the harpsichord in the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra (VSO).

His reputation as a fast and reliable learner has helped consolidate his standing as one of Vancouver's go-to pianists for last-minute musical emergencies of considerable might. Such came his 2018 VSO debut under the late music director, Bramwell Tovey, who asked him to step in on a 20-day notice to learn and subsequently premiere the Shalimar Variations, Tovey's 25-minute concerto for piano and orchestra. The premiere performance was recorded by the CBC. Dulu also competed in some of the more prestigious international piano competitions, among them Sendai, Helsinki,

New Orleans, Calgary (Honens), Bucharest (Enescu), Cincinnati, and Seattle. He toured extensively across Canada as a signed artist with Jeunesses Musicales and Debut Atlantic. His High-Voltage Piano/Piano Haute-Voltige program highlighting piano music of Marc-André Hamelin reached audiences across Eastern Canada with a marathon tour of 19 solo recitals in 7 weeks. He also toured the Northwest Territories, reaching communities above the Arctic Circle. He has performed in Europe, North America, Asia, and Africa, being equally at home as a soloist as well as a chamber musician, collaborative and orchestral pianist, coach, or public speaker. Radio appearances include NHK Tokyo, YLE Finland, Romanian Radio, KING FM Seattle, WFMT Chicago, and the CBC.

Dulu completed his undergraduate studies in Bucharest, Romania. He holds graduate degrees from Mannes School of Music in New York City (Masters) and the University of British Columbia in Vancouver (Doctorate), where he studied with Irina Morozova and Jane Coop, respectively. Dulu is the first pianist to have written a doctoral dissertation on Marc-André Hamelin's piano Études, researched under the personal guidance of the Canadian composer-pianist. It was during his doctoral studies at UBC that he developed a keen interest in the music of this legendary artist, with whom he worked closely during the final stages of the degree.

Dr. Dulu is a sought-after adjudicator for festivals and concerto competitions, and has given masterclasses at Dalhousie University, University of New Brunswick, and Douglas College, among others. He serves on the advisory committee for the Pacific International Youth Music Society, and is a member of the Canadian Federation of Musicians. He has taught sessionally at UBC, and is currently on the piano faculties of the Vancouver Academy of Music and the VSO School of Music, where he also serves at Keyboard Department Co-Chair.

Bogdan is a proud naturalized Canadian citizen, and lives on the traditional and unceded territories of the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh nations, colonially known as Vancouver, British Columbia. He is an amateur competitive cyclist, and has a rather costly affinity for carbon road bikes.

Riley Koenig-composition

Riley started his passion for music at an early age. He completed his ARCT in piano performance by 18. Riley then went on to complete a Bachelor in Music focusing on film scoring from Berklee College of Music in 2011. Landing a temporary gig with a Vancouver audio production house, he found a passion for music in games and has gone on to score over 50+ game titles with companies including Nintendo, Sega, and Microsoft. In addition to his active composition projects, Riley has also recently completed a doctorate of music in composition from The University of British Columbia.


